## **Dairy Product Diversification: Soft Ice Cream Manufacture**





Members of the Zhonggar dairy group have resolved to venture into soft ice cream production following an intensive three-day hands-on training on diversifying dairy products. This initiative has been made possible through the financial support provided by the CARLEP project. The launch of commercial milk ice cream production took place on November 19th, 2023, coinciding with the 61st Annual Mongar Thegchok Norbuling Tshechu. The honorable Dasho Dzongdag graced the inauguration ceremony.

The production will offer two variants of soft ice cream, each with distinct flavors, catering to consumer preferences.

Emphasizing the importance of hygiene in the production process, Dasho Dzongdag advised the group members to ensure a clean production line for the safe delivery of these food products to consumers. The group has committed to maintaining the brand's "uniqueness" and aims to process 10 kilograms of ice cream mix daily, resulting in approximately 180 cones of freshly made ice cream. This endeavor is anticipated to generate supplementary income, contributing to the improvement of livelihoods within the community.

## GEF (Global Environment Facility) Project Activity in Monggar Dzongkhag

GEF Ecotourism project seeks to mainstream biodiversity conservation into tourism development in Bhutan as a long-term strategy to mitigate threats to biodiversity and to generate sustainable conservation financing and livelihoods. The project demonstration approach focuses on landscape-scale covering two protected areas (PAs) of Bumdeling Wildlife Sanctuary (BWS) and Sakteng Wildlife Sanctuary (SWS) as well as in the five Dzong-khags (districts) of Lhuentse, Mongar, Trashigang, Trashi Yangtse and Zhemgang.

The GEF Ecotourism activities in Mongar Dzongkhag are as follows:

### 1. Birding development along TBT from Latongla to Zhongar

An allocation of nu. 9.177 million has been made to birding development along TBT stretching from Latongla to Zhongar. This allocation is designated for the execution of the following sub-activities:

- 1.1 Improvement of birding trail and amenities
- 1.2 Site development at Richanglu

The works have been awarded and it is expected to be finished before the end of next fiscal year. This project seeks not only to establish a premier destination for birding enthusiasts but also to bring a substantial boost to tourism and foster economic opportunities for the local community.



# 2. Trail enhancement and amenities development from Phurjulabtsa to Jaiphu

The trail, extending from Phurjulabtsa to Jaiphu, spans approximately 3km with an allocation of nu. 1.6 million. The enhancement of trail has been completed, and the construction of 2-unit toilet and canopy at Shamey is ongoing. Additionally, plans include the construction of canopy and swing at Jaiphu.

The trail not only promises to attract local tourists but also holds the potential to bring substantial benefits to the local community. It is going to create an enjoyable experience for the visitors, contributing to the overall prosperity of the region.

The third phase of the Million Fruit Tree Plantation (MFTP) nationwide is scheduled to commence in February 2024. The selected crops for this phase include apple, almond, pecan nut, mango, mandarin, bear lime, macadamia nut, avocado, and agarwood. All Bhutanese farmers interested in participating in this initiative are eligible to request seedlings.

## 10 bedded Hospital at Nagor under Silambi Gewog



The construction of 10 bedded hospital at Nagor under Silambi Gewog was awarded to M/s Sonam Jamtsho & Bros Construction Pvt. Ltd, Lhuentse at a contract price of Nu. 35.603 million and contract agreement was signed on 26.7.2022.

The stipulated contract duration is 20 months with the completion date of 25<sup>th</sup> Feb 2024. Collaboratively, the Dzongkhag Engineering and Health Sectors prepared the design drawings and cost estimates for the project. Currently, the construction is progressing ahead of schedule, and it is anticipated to be completed by the end of Dec. 2023, two months earlier than the initially projected completion date.



The hospital, upon completion, will offer a range of services, including dental & eye consultations, ultrasonography, x-ray facilities, child delivery service, counseling, immunization, and dedicated 5-bed male and female wards, in addition to general patient consultation. The timely completion of this hospital project is expected to significantly benefit the people of two gewogs, Silambi and Gongdue.
