








#### Crops of Fortune: Cardamom Production

Due to favorable market prices in 2023, cardamom farmers in Mongar Dzongkhag are encouraged to sustain their farming efforts. Across 13 Gewogs covering 403 acres in dry land farming. approximately 25 MT were produced, generating income of Nu.22.548 million from local trader sales. Additionally, 290 kg of produce is ready for dispatch, with the year's price doubling to a maximum of Nu.400 per kilo compared to the previous year. Previously, Agriculture Sector initiatives distributed seedlings to certain Gewogs, promoting multiplication within communities by sharing saplings among Gewogs and villages. Looking ahead, the Dzongkhag plans to establish two solar dryers for cardamom, one each in Silambi and Gongdue Gewogs, while technical assistance will persist from dedicated Extension Offices in the Gewogs.

# Watering the Future: Advanced Irrigation System

The Agriculture Research Development Centre (ARDC) Wengkhar successfully piloted an advanced irrigation system at Korkang village, Tsakaling Gewog. This innovative system utilizes real-time data for weather, soil moisture, and temperature, integrating rain sensors to prevent overwatering and runoff. Employing drip irrigation with centralized management, this system efficiently waters crops, aided



by a water pump that reduces energy consumption. Mr. Sonam Dorji, an entrepreneur, implemented this system across his 2-acre citrus orchard. costing Nu 103,081.00, with 30% funding from CARLEP/IFAD. The automated irrigation system positively impacts water efficiency, labor requirements, and orchard productivity. Expected benefits include increased crop yields by preventing water stress, nutrient leaching, and supporting fruit development.

The system aims to mitigate risks associated with inadequate or excessive watering, with its impact assessed in the upcoming season.

# Fodder Oat Cultivation: A Supplement to Winter Fodder Scarcity

Fodder oat cultivation combats winter scarcity for ruminants, vital for stable milk production. To counter this, free distribution of oat seeds aids winter fodder growth. The Dzongkhag Livestock Sector, funded by

CARLEP, provided 5250 KGs of oat seeds in October, 2023. This benefitted 356 households, expected to yield 2124.50 MT of green fodder, optimizing dairy production in lean seasons. Green oat fodder also aids winter fodder preservation as green silage. A good irrigation, fertilizer application, a cut and carry system of management would ensure the beneficiaries to harvest



the green oat fodder for three consecutive times. However, continuous oat cultivation in the same plot depletes soil nutrients, advocating crop rotation to maintain soil fertility. This significantly improgram proves rural livelihoods through dairy farming, suggesting continued subsidy support to combat rural poverty.

# A New Tshogpa for Zangkhar Chiwog



The ECB, under the Election Act of Bhutan, called for a Bye-Election in Zangkhar Chiwog, Dramedtse Gewog, Mongar Dzongkhag due to an incumbent's demise. With two Tshogpa candidates tying in votes, a Re-Election was mandated per Section 463 of the Act. Following the Third Local Government Elections on 28<sup>th</sup> September 2023, where 37 postal voters and 110 EVM voters determined the outcome. Oath of Allegiance was administered by Dasho

Dzongpon, Dzongkhag Court, while the ECB certificatation was handed over to the elected candidate by Dasho Dzongdag at Dratshang Kuenrey in presence of dignitaries.



## **Common Forum-An Electoral Platform to LISTEN**

The Dzongkhag Electoral Authority in Mongar conducted a series of common forums for the 2024 General Election from 14<sup>th</sup> to 29<sup>th</sup> December 2023 covering all three Demkhongs. According the figurative data, more women (2,288)than men (1,209)participated. Dramedtse Ngatshang had the highest voter turnout (1,394), while Kengkhar\_Weringla had the lowest (1,027). 74 forums were held across 17 Gewogs and a Throm. The Hon'ble Chief Election Commissioner shared electoral information during a forum at Wengkhar Community Meeting Hall on 28<sup>th</sup> December 2023, fostering public en-



gagement for the upcoming election. The Election Commission of Bhutan (ECB) plays pivotal role in



fostering democratic participation by organizing common forums. These forums serve as essential platforms where voters can engage meaningfully with political parties and candidates. By providing this inclusive space, the ECB ensures equitable opportunities for all parties to present their pledges. This approach significantly reduces potential inconveniences caused by simultaneous party meetings. Ultimately, these common forums aim to empower voters by facilitating informed decision-making and encouraging active participation in shaping the democratic process.

#### Revolutionizing Water Management: SCADA System for Gyalpoizhing Town



The Gyalpoizhing Town Water Supply system was successfully implemented through the Flagship Project by the De-Suung Partnership Project. The Project benefited 532 households with a population of 3,200, and it is projected for a population of 10,339 by 2052. The construction of an 11 km pipeline and two water reservoirs of 1,030,000 liters and 75,000 liters capacities cost Nu 42 Million.

The dzongkhag administration sought technical assistance from the Department of Culture and Dzongkha Development (DoCDD) for the renovation, given its need for specialized expertise. Ms. Sonam Choden, Architect and Mr. Namgyal Wangchuk, Civil Engineer from the DoCDD visited the site on Dec. 29, 2023. The officials were on the way to Thimphu from a site visit to the Trashiyangtse Rig Sum Goenpa. Before visiting the Wengkhar Nagtshang, the officials met with the Dzongdag, who outlined crucial issues, including the urgency of the renovation, a shortage of engineers, limited renovation capacity, and budget utilization given that half of the fiscal year 2023-2024 had already passed. Dzongdag also instructed the officials to collect essential additional information and prepare a comprehensive report for the Director and the officer in-charge, and expressed Dzongkhag's commitment and support to start the renovation work.
