contrast to grafted seedlings, non-grafted seedlings take longer duration to reach the fruit bearing stage. With the aim to promote high-value crops like almond and soft-shell walnut through expedited production, the Department of Agriculture, Thimphu, has initiated a mass grafting program for almond and walnut plantation throughout the country.

Given that the optimal time for grafting most temperate fruit seedlings falls within the months of February and March, a grafting program for almond and wal-


