Choosing Healthy Food: Quinoa for a Healthy Living



Quinoa is a nutrient-dense food with several health benefits. It is a great source of plant-based protein, fiber, and several key minerals.

In addition to its nutritional benefits, it is also gluten-free and a good source of protein for people who stick to vegetarian diets. Chaskhar Gewog have distributed 65 kilogram of Marangani variety of quinoa to 31 households, covering approximately

21 acres. Due to scarcity of rainfall during the sowing time, the germination was poor however, the Gewog is expecting to produce around 1 to 2 metric ton this year. Quinoa will be ready for harvest by the month of February.
