#### **Consultation meeting on National Tourism Policy**



The Chairperson and two esteemed members of the Economic and Finance Committee of the National Assembly of Bhutan made an official visit to Mongar Dzongkhag as part of their consultative engagement with local stakeholders. The visit aimed to gather ground-level perspectives on the National Tourism Policy and its implications for regional development. A consultative meeting was convened with the participation of Dzongkhag sector heads, local government leaders, hoteliers, representatives from the Bhutan Chamber of Commerce and Industry (BCCI), and the Mongar Taxi Association. The discussion provided a valuable platform for meaningful dialogue between policymakers and local stakeholders.

During the meeting, participants actively shared their views, experiences, and concerns related to the tourism sector's performance, particularly highlighting the challenges faced both before and after the COVID-19 pandemic. Issues such as limited infrastructure, policy implementation hurdles, and the need for more inclusive tourism strategies were discussed in depth. The session proved to be insightful and constructive, contributing to the Committee's ongoing effort to refine national policies in alignment with the realities and aspirations of local communities.



The initiative reflects the government's strong commitment to advancing data-driven agricultural development and ensuring that every farmer and their assets are properly documented.

The survey was carried out over a two-month period, from August to September 2025, through close coordination among relevant agencies. Data verification was done in collaboration with the National Land Commission for land ownership confirmation and the Census Department for household authentication, ensuring both accuracy and consistency. # **CARE-LG Project Training**



As per the instructions from DLGDM, the Planning Officer went to Tashigang as a trainer to train Dzongkhag and Gewog Officials on Climate Adaptation, Resilience, and Engagement in Local Government (CARE-LG) Project from 3<sup>rd</sup> to 14<sup>th</sup> September. Together with two co-trainers, the

#### Consultation Meeting on the Amendment of the Penal Code of Bhutan 2004



A half-day consultation meeting on the proposed amendment to the Penal Code of Bhutan 2004 was convened on 12<sup>th</sup> September at the Dzongkhag Tshogdu (DT) Hall. The session was led by the Hon'ble Members of the Legislative Committee of the National Council, who provided a com-

prehensive briefing on the rationale and key areas of the proposed changes. The event brought together representatives from the Dzongkhag Administration, Local Government leaders, and other relevant stakeholders, reflecting a diverse and inclusive platform for dialogue.

The main purpose of the meeting was to solicit public feed-back and gather insightful recommendations to ensure that the amendments align with the evolving social, legal, and cultural context of the nation. Participants actively engaged in discussions, expressing their perspectives and concerns on the implications of the proposed revisions. The consultation underscored the importance of participatory lawmaking, fostering a shared understanding between policymakers and the public to strengthen justice, fairness, and accountability within Bhutan's legal framework.

The event was honored by the esteemed presence of the MSA President, Dasho Dzongdag alongside other distinguished dignitaries including Dasho Drangpoen, Dasho SP, Dasho Dzongrab, DT Thrizin, Gups and sector heads.

The session was attended by a wide range of participants, including Dzongkhag and Court officials, school Principals, Gups, Desuups, cab drivers, and shopkeepers. The talk aimed to raise awareness and provide sensitization on the current situation of crime and drug abuse both within the Dzongkhag and nationwide.

During the session, the Deputy Chief of Police emphasized the shared responsibility of all stakeholders and community members in making their Dzongkhags, Gewogs, and localities free from crime and drug-related issues. He highlighted that while the focus has been placed on the Greater Mongar Community (GMC), other Dzongkhags are encouraged to adopt the same level of commitment and proactive measures. The program successfully engaged a total of 520 participants, fostering a collective understanding of the crucial role each individual plays in promoting safety and social well-being.
